Our School and Community

Faribault High School is located in the city of Faribault, in Rice County and is 25 miles south of the twin cities metropolitan area of Minneapolis and St. Paul. Population of Faribault is 28,959. There is one high school, one middle school and three elementary schools and one early childhood center, which serve the families and communities within the 13 square mile area of Independent School District 656. A member of the Big 9 Conference, FHS serves approximately 1,294 (9-12) students and growing. Current enrollment, including partially enrolled students, for FHS is:

Faculty and Staff

FHS has 121 full-time/part-time members including teachers, counselors, principals, special educators and a school nurse.

Curriculum

The curriculum is comprehensive and includes courses of study for college-bound students as well as for students planning to enter technical colleges, military, or employment. To meet the diverse needs of students, the curriculum includes Advanced Placement, College in the Schools, Concurrent Enrollment with South Central College, Technical Preparatory courses, along with a full range of special education and ELL courses, work program alternatives, and the MN Post-Secondary Enrollment Option.

School Day and School Year

The School day consists of six periods of classes, each approximately 50 minutes in length. The school year is divided into two semesters of eighteen (18) weeks. A student receives one-half credit for each semester course they pass.

Minimum Diploma Requirements

To be eligible for a diploma a student must have successfully completed a minimum of twenty-two (22) semester credits in grades 9-12. Special courses and minimum credits are required in the area of language arts, math, science, social studies, health, and physical education. Classes of 2016 and above are offered the opportunity to test the Accuplacer, ACT or Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test (ASVAB) for assessment equivalency. State standards will be adhered to as mandated by the Minnesota Department of Education.
